How the Sports Premium Grant will be used during 2015/2016

We plan to continue to use the Sports Premium Grant to purchase specialist input to enhance and update our teaching of PE as well as investing in more appropriate resources. This year we will be utilising Soccer 2000's support to help upskill our teaching assistants. Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will all benefit from one PE session per week led by Soccer 2000. Within this session the teaching assistants will work alongside the coaches to understand how they teach, differentiate and assess pupils when in small groups. We believe that this will help us further enhance the teaching of PE and firmly embed the high quality teaching and learning of PE into our curriculum.

Aims

- To continue to enhance the profile, delivery and standards in PE
- To facilitate Professional Development for teaching assistants through coaching and mentoring by Soccer 2000
- To give the teaching assistants the confidence and knowledge to teach, differentiate and assess groups of pupils in a range of PE curricular activities.
- To give the teaching assistants the confidence and knowledge to identify and target intervention for children who show difficulties of coordination and control

Activities

- We will continue with **three half day sessions of PE support per week** for the coming academic year to be provided by Soccer 2000
- Each year group (Reception, Year 1 & Year 2) will be divided between the classes one morning or afternoon a week. Two Soccer 2000 coaches will deliver PE lessons in line with the requirements of the National Curriculum **with teaching assistants**. The continued aim of these sessions is to deliver high quality PE

teaching and to provide high quality professional development for teaching assistants.

- Coaches & teaching assistants will also focus (together) on assessing the children's development and any intervention needs.
- Some monies have been put into the supply budget if there are any meetings needed with Wayne Clarke (Director Soccer 2000) in curriculum time to further develop our schemes of work and assessment systems
- We will use any of the grant left to purchase any additional PE scheme resources as and when required

Cost Breakdown

- Soccer 2000 - £7306 per year
- Supply/PE resources- £1294 per year

Measuring the impact of Sports Premium Grant spending - summary

At the end of the academic year we will use the success criteria listed below to evaluate the impact of the Sports Premium grant on our pupils.

Success Criteria

- **High quality PE teaching by qualified coaches for 1 year or beyond**
(evidenced through informal lesson observations & developments in planning and resourcing)
- **Teaching assistants more knowledgeable and confident in the way to teach PE to small groups**
(evidenced through informal lesson observations/appraisal interviews with TA's)
- **Teaching assistants more knowledgeable and confident in their ability to identify and support more able & less able children in PE**
(evidenced through informal lesson observations/appraisal interviews with TA's)
- **Through Soccer 2000's coaching and teaching assistants support all children making gains in learning through appropriate PE teaching**
(evidenced through informal lesson observations and intervention records)
- **New PE equipment that fully matches the school's curriculum** – new resources purchased that match new scheme of work and stored more clearly to help ease of use

Evaluation/Impact at end of Academic year 2015/2016

- Soccer 2000 continue to provide high quality PE sessions for our Key Stage 1 pupils. The Medium term plans are firmly in place all plans are kept centrally in files in the Deputy Heads classroom. Formal and informal lesson observations have taken place by Christ Church and Soccer 2000's Director (Wayne Clarke). These evidenced consistent good practice and high quality PE teaching. The assessment system also helped give teachers up to date and accurate assessment information when reporting to parents.
- Soccer 2000 provided 4 sessions a week alongside Christ Church teaching assistants in Key stage 1. During the year the teaching assistants took on a range of roles from support/assessor to leader to give them a greater understanding of the way Soccer 2000 work when delivering PE. All staff involved feel clearer in their role and informal observations/discussions demonstrated a greater confidence in their ability to effectively support the pupils in a range of PE

activities. We again feel that these areas of strength relate directly to the support and input of the Soccer 2000 coaches.

- Now that the assessment system is embedded with both teachers and teaching assistants we are now able to more easily identify our most and least able pupils. From this we are able to tailor the activities within a lesson to best suit their needs. We have also used this information to provide additional support for pupils with fine and gross motor skills problems (i.e Cool kids).
- The Sports premium allowed us to continue to update our PE resources and ensure that pupils are fully resourced for all of their timetabled activities.
- We believe with the support of Soccer 2000 the developments are now embedded into our school and we feel that they are sustainable beyond the funding because of the way the funding has been specifically targeted.
